The Work Session was called to order by Paula Fudge at 7:05 p.m.

The Council scheduled this Work Session and invited the Stormwater Management Committee members to present their final report to Town residents. Committee members reviewed the data collected by the Committee and presented recommended actions.

The Council thanked the Committee for their hard work and expressed its appreciation for the thoroughness of their report.

Council Chair, Paula Fudge, shared with those present the steps the Town Council has taken to regulate stormwater management and announced that the Town will apply for a Chesapeake and Coastal Service Grant from the Maryland Department of Natural Resources to study stormwater drainage issues in the Town (implementation of one of the Committee's recommendations).

At the conclusion of the Stormwater Management Committee's final presentation, the Council discussed the revised Clark/Azar Final Design and Permitting proposal for FY21 and FY22, dated July 25, 2021. At the July 21, 2021 monthly meeting, based on the Stormwater Management Committee's recommendation, the Council directed Clark/Azar to revise its June 11, 2021 proposal to include green infrastructure concepts, examine cost differentials for green/gray infrastructure, while being sensitive to maintaining the schedule for budgeted FY22 capital improvements. The Clark/Azar proposal for civil engineering services (which include survey/base sheet development, construction documents, coordination with the Maryland State Highway administration to review hydraulics of storm drains that connect and outfall into Connecticut Avenue, bidding services and construction administration. Nancy Somerville moved that the proposal in the amount of \$57,921.00 be approved. Lisa Fair seconded the motion and it passed with a 5-0 vote.

The meeting adjourned at 8:10 p.m.
